This short film presents the Gypsy and Traveller rally at City Hall organised in 2010 in response to the Mayor of London's removal of pitch targets from the London Plan. A large group of Gypsy and Traveller activists and supporters including London Assembly Members marched around City Hall and gave speeches, raising awareness of the impacts of this policy.

3. Presentation of the Gypsy and Traveller Manifesto – Ilinca Diaconescu, LGTU

<u>The London Gypsy and Traveller Manifesto</u> was produced through four meetings of the London Gypsy and Traveller Forum in 2015, bringing together the experiences of community members across London as well as research and evidence on four different topics: accommodation, employment, health and education. Through presentations of best practice

and discussions of the Forum, the Manifesto makes a number of recommendations to the Mayor of London and the GLA.

4. Invitation to the representatives of the candidates to give a short response to the Gypsy and Traveller Manifesto

We invited Mayoral and London Assembly candidates from the four main political parties to attend the meeting and respond to the concerns and recommendations from the Forum.

Jennette Arnold, Labour

- Advised to match manifesto against promises made by candidates
- Sadiq Khan pledges to be a Mayor for ALL Londoners
- Plans to use GLA and local authority land for housing
- After election use manifesto and London Plan process to argue for our demands

Caroline Russell, Green Party

- Housing is the biggest crisis in London and Gypsies and Travellers are part of this; this should be one of the strongest campaigning points
- Would promote negotiated stopping model proposed by Leeds GATE, particularly on land temporarily vacant before development
- Need to use powers of the London Assembly: scrutiny, reports, evidence; ensure Committees commission the right reports
- If elected on Assembly will bring in people's voices

Caroline Pidgeon, Liberal Democrats – written statement read out by Clemmie

5. Open to the floor - questions and comments to the panel

- Report from Equality and Human Rights Commission puts blame on racism and discrimination for inequalities suffered by Gypsies and Travellers. What are the parties doing to address racism and discriminatory attitudes among their elected members?
 - Politicians needs to lead by good practice and stand up to discrimination and opposition to Gypsy and Traveller sites
 - Need to challenge ignorance behind racism
- Need educational and cultural awareness resources in schools.
 Traveller Education hasn't had any support in recent years.
- There are issues regarding the insecurity of negotiated stopping

 In some boroughs the departments dealing with Gypsies and Travellers are completely inappropriate, for example crime reduction, pest control, environmental health
