



Loss of council sites


Number of pitches on Local Authority sites and Gypsy and Irish Traveller population (2011)




*** In 2004 the Housing Act introduced a duty on Local Authorities to assess and meet the accommodation needs of Gypsies and Travellers




Gypsy and Traveller population estimate (2007) and need for new pitches between 2007-2017 (2007)

What the housing crisis means for Gypsies and Travellers in London

- More families pushed in unsuitable housing
- Temporary and emergency accommodation
- Discrimination and frequent evictions in the private rented sector

- Rise in unauthorised encampments
 - Huge social costs: family and community life, health, education, work
 - Challenge of density/viability vs social value and equality duty
