Universal Credit and housing costs - effects on Gypsies and Travellers living on sites

Dual Claims

- under Universal Credit regulation 2013 there does not appear to have any clear information on entitlement when making a dual claim other than some general guidance;
- "if you are responsible for paying the rent for two properties, Universal Credit may help towards both rents. It may be paid to you as part of the Housing Element. You will then need to pay your rent to your landlord(s) yourself"
- Therefore how to complete a claim and request housing costs for 2 properties and 2 different landlords is unclear.



Difficulties in claiming Housing Costs

► Imputing housing costs

Lack of clarity of how much Housing costs is allocated for each landlord

Lack of clarity how Housing Costs are worked out

Private rented – Housing costs is set by Local Housing Allowance under Universal Credit

However renting a mobile home is determined by Evaluation office

Exemptions

Living in temporary, emergency, supported or sheltered accommodation

If you receive a severe disability premium



 Private Rented Sector affordability and condition
 Council housing, social housing and future build
- Cross-cutting themes: tenants' voice, the benefit system, gender, groups who are particularly vulnerable, security of tenure, access to housing, and living in mixed communities.

Update: London Plan Examination



- Consolidated Plan (with suggested changes marked up)- published second week of June
- GLA's receipt of Inspectors' Report –
 September 2019. The GLA then has 8 weeks to publish this from date of receipt.
- Mayor to send revised draft Plan; the Intend to Publish Plan, to Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government-late 2019
- Mayor to lay a copy of the draft proposals before the London Assembly - early 2020
- Publication of the final Plan early 2020




London mayoral election, 2020


