The 2011 Census found that...

...54% of Gypsies and Travellers over 16 do not have qualifications, compared to the 18% London average

...Over 50% of Gypsies and Travellers in London are not working, compared to the 33% London average

We know that...

...7 in 10 Gypsies and Travellers hide their ethnicity

...the Gypsy and Traveller population has a very high percentage of young people

...there are barriers to getting into work, setting up a business or getting training for Gypsy and Traveller women and men of all ages
