TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION



ACCOMMODATION ADVICE SERVICE

Main aims:

- Provide advice to Gypsy and Traveller families living in houses, on official sites and unauthorised encampments in most London boroughs
- To support our service users in gaining skills and confidence, which will help them maintain their tenancy and deal with statutory services effectively



FACTS AND FIGURES

- > 170,000 homeless in London
- > 54,000 families in T.A. in London
- The LGT Accommodation Advice Service currently sees approximately 78 families living in T.A. majority have been in T.A. for over 3 years
- ➤ Difficulty finding reliable data regarding the Travelling community due to nomadic lifestyle and not wanting to identify themselves due to prejudice







WHAT IS TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION?

- >T.A. can be provided by your local council if you become homeless
- > T.A. includes: Bed & Breakfasts, hostels, refuges, shared accommodation, bedsits, studio flats, and private rented accommodation
- There is no limit on how long you could stay in T.A. as long as the council say it is suitable for you









GYPSIES + TRAVELLERS COULD QUALIFY FOR T.A. IF THEY:

- ➤ Face eviction from their pitch, encampment or tenancy
- > Have nowhere legal to park their mobile home



LONDON GYPSIES & TRAVELLERS

ISSUES GYSPIES & TRAVELLERS FACE IN T.A.

- **>** Unsuitability
- **≻**Isolation
- **≻** Vulnerability
- ➤ Prejudice and racism
- **>** Unaffordability
- ➤ Overcrowding
- >School links lost
- >Changes to benefits causing debt







LONDON GYPSIES & TRAVELLERS

HOW THIS AFFECTS GYPSIES + TRAVELLERS

- > Family and community links lost
- > Common traditions and shared way of life
- Young, single women being placed in hostels or B+B
- Restrictions on visitors
- Being exposed and vulnerable to prejudice
- > Physical and mental health can deteriorate





CASE STUDIES

11

5 evictions on the same day:

- > Landlord reclaims properties and evicts tenants served Section 21
- Geraldine contacted Council housing dept. immediately
- Was able to bypass the Home Connections stage to save time and effort
- > Provided detailed information on each family: children, health, etc.
- Found Temporary Accommodation properties for each family

Unsuitable hostel:

- > Young, heavily pregnant woman placed in mixed hostel
- Verbally abused over Traveller heritage by other residents
- Surrounded by alcohol and drug use
- > Council housing dept. said they could not move her again
