


## **Positive solutions**

## Permanent site provision


Local authorities can identify small sites for family homes, exploring innovative delivery partnerships and good design.

## **Negotiated stopping**

Local authorities and other landowners can choose to take a balanced and humane approach to managing roadside camps.

Negotiated stopping is based on a mutual agreement between the landowner and Gypsy and Traveller families on matters such as the stopping period, correct waste disposal and basic temporary facilities – sometimes directing people away from contentious public spaces to more appropriate land.

This approach is proven to achieve significant savings in public spending and decreased social costs for Gypsy and Traveller communities.

Gypsies and Travellers are often not listened to and represented by their local councillors and other elected politicians. Experiences of racism and discrimination can deter people from engaging with authorities and services.

Politicians can play a really important role in advancing equality and inclusion and building positive relationships and trust with their Gypsy and Traveller constituents.
